#### Easter Rebellion presented at Watertown Library (March 14th, 7-9 pm):

Join fellow Hibernian John Horrigan as he helps the Ancient Order of Hibernians (Division 14) celebrate "Irish Heritage Month" with a presentation about the Easter Rebellion of 1916 in Ireland. The Easter Rising was an insurrection staged in Ireland during Easter Week, 1916. The Rising, organized by the Irish Republican Brotherhood attempted to establish an Irish Republic by ending British rule in Ireland. The Rebellion lasted from Easter Monday (April 24th) to April 30th, 1916. Members of the Irish Volunteers and the smaller Irish Citizen Army seized key locations in Dublin and proclaimed the Irish Republic independent of Britain. The Rising was brutally suppressed after seven days of fighting, and its leaders were court-martialled and executed, but it succeeded in bringing Irish sovereignty back to the forefront of Irish consciousness and representation in British Parliament.

#### St. Patrick's Mass (March 17<sup>th</sup>, 12:00 pm Mass):

Once again the members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians have been invited by Cardinal Sean O'Malley to serve at the Mass at the Holy Cross Cathedral on the feast of Saint Patrick on Thursday, March 17<sup>th</sup> at 12:00 pm. The Cardinal himself will be celebrating the Mass and will greet all after the Mass. We of the Ancient Order of Hibernians have been honored to do this for a number of years.
