Personal care and how to protect yourself

Can supplements fight COVID-19?

(important note - no supplement can cure or prevent disease)

1. Vitamin D is a fat-soluble nutrient essential to the health and functioning of your immune system. Vitamin D is essential for immune function. Healthy levels of this vitamin may help lower your risk of respiratory infections.
2. Zinc is needed for immune cell development and communication and plays an important role in inflammatory response. Supplementing with zinc may help protect against respiratory tract infections and reduce the duration of these infections.
3. Vitamin C is perhaps the most popular supplement taken to protect against infection due to its important role in immune health. Vitamin C is vital for immune health. Supplementing with this nutrient may reduce the duration and severity of upper respiratory tract infections, including the common cold.
4. Elderberry which has long been used to treat infections, is being researched for its effects on immune health.

How to protect yourself?

1. Washing your hands correctly for at least 20 seconds - - or using a hand sanitizer is still the best way to prevent the disease.
2. Stay home when you can.
3. Follow the local public health guidelines.
4. Boost your immune system. Your body is better able to fight off illness when your immune system is in good shape. During this time, get adequate sleep and try to get some fresh air and sunlight daily.
5. Try to stay calm, mental health is important as well. High stress levels can take a toll on your immune system , which is the opposite of what you want in our current situation.

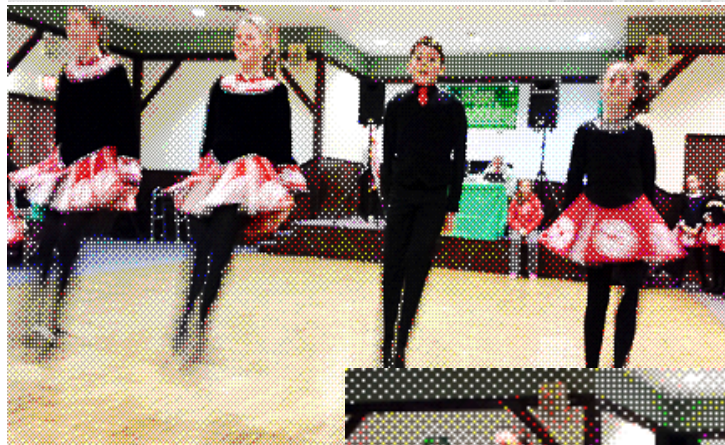
