Political Education (PE): In today's PE section, and with the recent efforts to support a Gaza ceasefire, I want to explain why Ireland is clashing with the Israeli government in support of the Palestinian people.

During the Great Hunger (1845–1852), aka the Irish Potato Famine, British government policies exacerbated the suffering of the Irish population. While the potato blight devastated the primary food source for millions, British authorities continued to export vast quantities of Irish-grown food, such as grain and livestock, to England, prioritizing profits over humanitarian aid. Relief efforts were often minimal, delayed, or conditional on harsh measures, such as mandatory labor in workhouses under brutal conditions.

The parallels between Ireland's history and the Palestinian struggle are evident to many Irish people. Both have experienced dispossession of land, efforts to suppress their culture and language, and policies that have weaponized basic needs like food and resources against their populations. Reports from various human rights organizations and international bodies have accused Israel of employing starvation as a method of warfare against the civilian population in the Gaza Strip, actions that constitute serious violations of international humanitarian law.

- On May 22nd, amid increasing international criticism of Israel's actions in the Israel–Hamas war, the Irish Government announced that it recognized the state of Palestine, in a coordinated action with the governments of Norway and Spain.
- In October, Ireland joined <u>South Africa's International Court of Justice</u>
 (ICJ) <u>case</u> accusing Israel of committing genocide in Gaza. In late
 December, Israel announced it would close its embassy in Ireland.

In welcoming the news of the ceasefire, President Biden quoted Senator George Mitchell who chaired the Irish Peace talks that led to the Good Friday Agreement, "seven hundred days of failure and one day of success."

<u>Freedom For All Ireland: (FFAI)</u>: A deal was reached between Fianna Fail, Fine Gael and Independent factions to form the next Northern Ireland (NI) government. Fianna Fail (48 seats) & Fine Gael (38 seats), fell just short of the 88 needed to achieve a majority without third-parties. Sinn Fein won 39 seats, but Fine Gael and Fianna Fail have refused to work with Sinn Fein because of their historic ties with the Irish Republican Army during three decades of violence in NI.

LAOH / AOH Division 14 Marching in the South Boston St. Patrick's Day/Evacuation Day Parade Sunday, March 16, 2025




LAOH & AOH members at the 2024 Boston St. Patrick's Day Parade
